

EVENT OUTLINE

This seminar is aimed at the chiropractor who would like to develop their paediatric knowledge base, incorporate paediatric care within their practice and provide a professional and competent service for very young patients, their parents and other health care professions. It will be a mix of theory, practical and role play.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- First interaction with parent/carer and child—understanding legal responsibility and consent
- Collection of medical history from preconception to date
- Understand the presenting complaint and assessing current state of health of the child. Identify red and yellow flags
- Physical examination of the young child including vital signs, developmental milestones, neurological and musculoskeletal assessment
- Insight into the role of other healthcare practitioners in the NHS and how to work with them in supporting the parent child dyad
- Understanding the role of the chiropractor in supporting common conditions from a neuro-musculoskeletal perspective
- Treatment techniques to support and address commonly presenting conditions

SPEAKERS: Alexandra Newton FRCC (Paeds) and Catherine Daykin (Public Health Practitioner)

Alexandra is the chair of the Royal College of Chiropractors Pregnancy and Paediatrics Faculty. She graduated from AECC (UC) in 1990. After a three year associateship position with an established chiropractor in Derby, set up her own practice in Beeston, Nottingham in 1993, where she has mentored many graduates through the RCC's PRT programme. Alex sees a growing percentage of paediatric patients, many of which are referred to her by local health care trusts. She completed her MSc Advanced Practitioner Practice in paediatric musculoskeletal health in 2014 at AECC (UC) and became a Fellow of the Royal College of Chiropractors.

Catherine's current role is as a specialist public health practitioner, working with children and young people in a 0-19 service, to support them to achieve optimal health, well-being and developmental outcomes. She graduated in 1997 after studying for a Nursing Diploma (Adult Branch) at the University of Wales. She went on to complete a BSc in Midwifery at the Thames Valley University. She has worked on a rotational basis over antenatal and postnatal wards and delivery suite as well as in the community. Catherine has been in her current role for 5 years since completing a postgraduate diploma in specialist community public health nursing (health visiting) working in both county and inner city environments.
